

TOTAL FUNDS COLLECTED 2019 - R1,035,000

On a bright and sunny day early in April 2019, 190 enthusiastic athletes took on the gruelling task of ascending Table Mountain as many times as possible in one day in order to raise funds for local charitable organisations. Together the athletes managed a total of 792 summits, which equates to 4,350km walked and total ascent of 600km climbed.
